## Individual Support

Our experienced Early Intervention team works alongside families to help them support their child's learning through setting foundations for future growth and development. We offer families individual and group programs.

Services are tailored and include education regarding diagnosis and therapies, setting and working towards developmental goals, assistance with specialist medical appointments and transition to childcare, preschool and school.

Our Early Intervention individual and group programs are a fun and effective way for our clients to reach their potential.

## Individual Support

### Target Group

Children aged 0-6 years with a sensory impairment.

### What to expect

Individual Early Intervention support works alongside families to develop skills through play based activities that focus on the child's overall development.

Support is provided by an Early Intervention Consultant who has specialist training in working with children who have a sensory impairment.

Our Early Intervention Consultants work in a variety of ways including:

- Providing individual support
- Working in small groups
- Working within educational settings
- Developing home based program
- Providing resources and information

Sessions may occur weekly, fortnightly or monthly.

Children will be supported with a focus on:

- Appropriate lighting and positioning
- Appropriate environments to facilitate

active listening as well as the use of contrast and sounds to supplement vision

- Education, support and information about vision and hearing, as well as a focus on overall development
- Providing opportunities to maximise sensory and tactile experiences
- Using strategies to complement hearing where appropriate such as visual aids, key word signing and gesture

### Aims of the program

Individual Early Intervention support aims to monitor and develop the skills important in preparation for preschool and school.

### Goals of the program

Goals are individually negotiated with the child's family.

### Outcomes

Outcomes may include:

- Meeting specific individual goals
- Connecting families with other families
- Access to the community
- Increased understanding around vision/hearing impairment

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## Individual Support

### Eligibility Criteria

Families must be registered for services with Can:Do 4Kids

### Staff

Early Intervention Consultants have a professional background in child development and learning. We work alongside families to support their child's learning through setting foundations for future growth and development.

Can:Do 4Kids Early Intervention Consultants work as a part of a multidisciplinary team alongside Speech Pathologists and Occupational Therapists, Assistive Technology specialists, Child and Youth Development Consultants, Orientation and Mobility specialists, Physiotherapists, Social Workers and Audiologists.
